#### FROM THE HARBOUR MASTERS CHAIR

till little sun appearing so many navigation lights remain out or extinguish before morning. Nearly all these lights are in the middle channel so do not affect boats transiting the river from the sea to the harbour office. Plenty of lights though at the western arm where much work is proceeding with the terminal groyne restructuring. The contractors ceased for three the craft had been let go weeks over the Christmas period but retained a watchman who kept the lights burning. Similarly, the contractors at the fish market also stopped work for the period. 




